

## **Computer translation of the Czech Ministry of Health measure regarding accommodation (Hotels etc.)**

Effective from 00:00 on 31 May 2021 until the revocation of this emergency measure, the following shall:

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5. set the conditions for the provision of short-term and holiday accommodation services by:

(a) hand disinfection shall be provided at the entrance to the accommodation service premises and in the internal areas and the operator shall ensure regular disinfection of touch surfaces (handles, handrails, hand switches),

(b) accommodation service providers shall place disinfectants at frequently touched surfaces (especially handles, handrails, handrails, switches) so that they are available to staff and customers of the establishments and can be used for regular disinfection,

(c) unless otherwise specified below, accommodations may be provided only to persons who do not exhibit clinical signs of covid-19 disease and except for children under 6 years of age

(i) demonstrate that they meet the conditions set out in I/17; or

(ii) demonstrate by certification from their employer that they have completed, not more than 72 hours previously, a SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen test for self-testing or a test authorized by the Department of Health for use by a lay person with a negative result; or

(iii) provides an affidavit, or the affidavit of his or her legal guardian, that he or she has received a SARS-CoV-2 antigen test at the school or educational facility no more than 72 hours previously, which is for self-testing or authorized by the Department of Health for use by a lay person, with a negative result; or

(iv) undergoes a preventive antigen test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen that is self-tested or authorised by the Ministry of Health for use by a lay person, with negative results;

such persons may be accommodated for a maximum of 7 days, and for the extension of their stay they must again comply with that condition or undergo a preventive antigen test on the spot for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 antigen, which is intended for self-testing or authorised by the Ministry of Health for use by a lay person, with negative results,

(d) without complying with the condition under (b), accommodation services may be provided in separate buildings:

(i) persons who have been ordered to be isolated or quarantined,

(ii) persons for the purpose of completing accommodation commenced before the entry into force of this emergency measure, if they have no other residence in the territory of the Czech Republic,

(i) persons in housing need for whom accommodation has been arranged by a local authority

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17. establish the following conditions for the entry of persons into certain indoor and outdoor areas or for participation in mass events, if required by this emergency measure:

(a) the person has been RT-PCR tested for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus with negative results no more than 7 days ago; or

(b) the person has undergone a POC test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 antigen with negative results no more than 72 hours previously; or

(c) the person has been vaccinated against covid-19 disease and provides evidence by a national certificate of vaccination, which is a written certificate issued at least in the English language by an authorised body operating in the Czech Republic, in another Member State of the European Union or in a country listed in the Communication of the Ministry of Health as a country or part thereof with a low risk of contracting covid-19 disease, the model of which is published in the list of recognised national certificates on the website of the Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic, which contains information on the person vaccinated, the type of vaccine administered, the date of administration of the vaccine, identification of the entity that issued the certificate, that the vaccination has expired:

(i) at least 22 days since the administration of the first dose of vaccine in the case of a two-dose schedule according to the SPC, but not more than 90 days if the second dose has not been administered,

(ii) at least 22 days but not more than 9 months since the first dose of vaccine was administered in the case of a two-dose schedule according to the SPC, if a second dose was administered; or

(iii) at least 14 days, but not more than 9 months, after the administration of a dose of vaccine in the case of a single-dose schedule according to the SPC; or

(d) the person has laboratory-confirmed covid-19 disease, has passed the isolation period as defined by the applicable Department of Health emergency measure, and no more than 180 days have elapsed since the first positive POC antigen test for SARS-CoV-2 antigen or RT-PCR test for SARS-CoV-2 virus.

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
